## **Research Presentation Directions**

To truly master a subject, you should be able to explain it to your peers in succinct ways. You will be expected to present a 7-8 minutes presentation on your research paper. Your presentation must include the following as it relates to your specific paper:

- Introduction that outlines the issue
- Relevant data
- Economic theory from class
- A policy recommendation
- Conclusion that summarizes the main points of your paper

You will also be asked to dress in business casual. Presentation skills will also be graded. Specifically, you should focus on the following while presenting:

- Speaking clearly at a proper pace
- Making eye contact with your audience
- Avoiding "filler words"
- Concise slides
- Straight posture
- Staying on topic

You are expected to use at least one visual aid. Visual aids could include but are not limited to the whiteboard, PowerPoint, posters, and/or movies. These visual aids must help in the classes understanding of your chosen topic.

Presentations are seven to eight minutes long. Make sure to adjust for any questions that may arise during your presentation. You must submit your presentation

online by 3/29 by 9:40am. To submit your presentation, go to Blackboard, then the "Course Materials" tab, then click on the "Research Presentations" link. If you are using a PowerPoint, upload these slides. If you are not using slides, please upload the notes that you plan to use during your presentation. Although there will be three days of presentations, each student should be prepared to present on the first day. Specifically, the due date and presentation dates are listed below:
